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1. MANAGED CARE OPPORTUNITY ASSESSMENT (UPDATED 2-8-21)

The bulk of Colorado's Medicaid members are covered through the state's Accountable Care Collaborative (ACC) program, an enhanced primary care case management system, which began in May 2011.

Colorado began Phase II of the ACC program in July 2018. Five organizations were awarded contracts to act as Regional Accountable Entities (RAEs) in the state's 7 regions. Rocky Mountain Health Plans serves region 1, Northeast Health Partners region 2, Colorado Access regions 3 and 5, Health Colorado region 4, and Colorado Community Health Alliance regions 6 and 7. On January 1, 2020, the state contracted with a sixth RAE, Denver Health Medicaid Choice, to serve Medicaid enrollees who were previously attributed to RAE 5, Colorado Access. Denver Health Medicaid Choice covers about 100,000 members who live in Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, or Jefferson counties.

Phase II of the program integrates behavioral and physical health under one RAE in each of the state's seven regions. It also advances coordinated care by supporting a system of multidisciplinary health teams, including specialty behavioral health providers, long-term services and supports, and case management agencies; automatically enrolls full-benefit Medicaid clients in the ACC; and increases the use of value-based payments for both RAEs and providers.

The RAEs replace the Regional Care Collaborative Organizations (RCCOs) and five behavioral health organizations (BHOs).

2. MEDICAID MANAGED CARE FINANCES

Average MLR among five Medicaid Regional Accountable Entities in Colorado was 85.8% in 2021. Per member per month premiums averaged \$84.

3. RFP DEVELOPMENTS AND ANALYSIS (UPDATED 11-21-19)

In November 2017 the state awarded contracts to five organizations to act as Regional Accountable Entities (RAEs). Reunion Health/Rocky Mountain Health Plans will serve region 1, Northeast Health Partners region 2, Colorado Access regions 3 and 5, Health Colorado region 4, and Colorado Community Health Alliance Plus regions 6 and 7. Community Care of Central Colorado was the only incumbent that was not awarded a contract. New entrants include Northeast Health Partners and Health Colorado. Contracts run from July 2018 through June 30, 2020, with 7 one-year renewals. Current contracts are anticipated to run through July 2025. As of January

1, 2020, Denver Health Medicaid Choice covers about 100,000 members who live in Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, or Jefferson counties.

4. MANAGED CARE ENROLLMENT UPDATE

Enrollment in Colorado's six Regional Accountable Entities was 1.6 million in 2022 compared to year-end 2021. Previous members in Denver Health Medicaid Choice were attributed to RAE 5, Colorado Access. As of January 1, 2020, Denver Health Medicaid Choice covers about 80,000 members who live in Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, or Jefferson counties. The program went live in July 2018. Previously, Colorado had five Regional Care Collaborative Organizations, with enrollment of nearly 973,000 as of May 2018.



5. MEDICAID FEE FOR SERVICE VS. MANAGED CARE PENETRATION

Total Medicaid enrollment in Colorado was nearly 1.7 million in 2021. About 88.2% of Medicaid beneficiaries were enrolled in a managed care plan. The remainder are in fee-for-service Medicaid. Total Medicaid expenditures in Colorado were \$10.7 billion in 2021, with about 12.9% through managed care and the rest through fee-for-service.
