# **Rhode Island**

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#### 1. MEDICARE OVERVIEW FOR RHODE ISLAND (UPDATED 3-11-21)

Rhode Island Medicare enrollment was nearly 226,000 in 2020, with about 109,000 enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan. About 16% of the state's total Medicare population is comprised of individuals with disabilities. Rhode Island's dual demonstration began allowing voluntary opt-in enrollment in Neighborhood Health Plan of Rhode Island's Integrity plan in May 2016 and began passive enrollment in July 2016. Enrollment was down nearly 9% to just under 13,000 members at year-end 2020, after decreasing nearly 10% in 2019. The demonstration was set to end in December 2020, but Neighborhood signed a three-year contract extension to continue its participation in the program through 2023. Moreover, enrollment in Rhode Island's SNP market was just over 6,000 as of November 2020.

#### 2. MEDICARE ADVANTAGE PLAN FINANCIALS

Medicare Advantage plans in Rhode Island generated total premiums of nearly \$926 million in 2019 and medical costs of \$771 million. Average MLR was 83.2% after reinsurance recoveries.

(Note: Financial metrics and comparisons presented in this overview are based on health plan NAIC filings in the state. Measures like per member per month premiums and medical loss ratios may vary greatly by plan and by state depending on the mix of business and other factors.)

## 3. MEDICARE ADVANTAGE PLAN UTILIZATION METRICS

Medicare Advantage plans averaged 171,444 physician visits per 1000 members in 2018 and 113,433 bed days per 1000. Days per admission averaged 45.7.

# 4. MEDICARE ADVANTAGE PLAN PREMIUMS, DEDUCTIBLES, STAR RATINGS

Rhode Island's top five Medicare Advantage plans had STAR ratings of 3.5 to 4.5 in 2020. Maximum premium ranged from \$0 per month at Neighborhood Health Plan of RI and PACE Organization of RI to \$265 at BCBS of RI.

## 5. MEDICARE ADVANTAGE ENROLLMENT UPDATE

There were nearly 226,000 Medicare members in Rhode Island in 2020, up 1.3% from 2019. Traditional Medicare accounted for just over half of the total at 51.7%; however, its share is declining. Medicare Advantage enrollment accounted for 48.3% of the total at about 109,000, a 7.8% increase in 2020 compared to year-end 2019. Excluding Prescription Drug Plan and 800 Series enrollment, Medicare Advantage members rose 7.4% to 100,793 in 2020.

Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Rhode Island is the largest Medicare Advantage plan in the state, followed by UnitedHealth Group and Neighborhood Health Plan of Rhode Island.

#### 6. SNPs and Dual Eligibles

Rhode Island's capitated dual eligible demonstration began allowing voluntary opt-in enrollment in Neighborhood Health Plan of Rhode Island's Integrity plan in May 2016 and began passive enrollment in July 2016. The demonstration was set to end in December 2020, but Neighborhood signed a three-year contract extension to continue its participation in the program through 2023. Neighborhood had just under 13,000 dual members in the program as of year-end 2020.

The state also had a total of just over 6,000 Special Needs Plan members as of November 2020, of which 4,867 were dual eligibles. UnitedHealth Group was the sole health plan in the SNP market.
