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## 1. MANAGED CARE OPPORTUNITY ASSESSMENT (UPDATED 11-22-24)

Hawaii awarded its QUEST Integration (QI) Medicaid managed care contracts in March 2021 to Alohacare, Centene/WellCare, Hawaii Medical Service Association (HMSA), Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, and UnitedHealthcare. Plans were awarded statewide contracts, except for Kaiser which won a contract for Oahu and Maui only. All winners are incumbents and will continue to serve 378,000 Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) members with integrated medical, behavioral and long-term care coverage. Implementation began July 1, 2021, with contracts running to December 31, 2026, with three additional optional years. The total contract worth, including optional years, is \$17 billion.

In February 2021, the Hawaii Department of Human Services awarded a contract to manage the state's Community Care Services (CCS) program to incumbent Centene/WellCare. The contract, which covers behavioral health services to more than 4,500 Medicaid-eligible adults with serious mental illness or serious and persistent mental illness, runs from July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2024, with two optional one-year extensions. Centene/WellCare/Ohana has held the contract since 2013.

AlohaCare and Ohana Health Plan have been offering basic dental coverage to about 364,000 adult Medicaid beneficiaries since 2018.

#### **Hot Topics:**

Hawaii received federal approval for section 1115 demonstration amendments to provide multi-year continuous eligibility for children beyond the minimum 12 months required by law. The amendments will allow continuous eligibility for children up to six years of age.

Hawaii has applied for a five-year extension of its Section 1115 Hawaii QUEST Integration waiver through July 31, 2029. The proposal includes pre-release services for justice-involved individuals, nutrition supports, contingency management, rental assistance expansion, and medical respite to the state's Community Integration Services program.

### 3. RFP DEVELOPMENTS AND ANALYSIS (UPDATED 11-22-24)

Hawaii awarded its QUEST Integration (QI) Medicaid managed care contracts in March 2021 to Alohacare, Centene/WellCare, Hawaii Medical Service Association (HMSA), Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, and UnitedHealthcare. Plans were awarded statewide contracts, except for Kaiser which was awarded a contract for Oahu and Maui only. All winners are incumbents and will continue to serve 378,000 Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) members with integrated medical, behavioral and long-term care coverage. Implementation began July 1, 2021, with contracts running to December 31, 2026, with three additional optional years. The total contract worth, including optional years, is \$17 billion. The state had previously awarded contracts to Alohacare, Centene/WellCare, HMSA, and UnitedHealthcare on January 22, 2020; however, those contracts were rescinded because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

In February 2021, the Hawaii Department of Human Services awarded a contract to manage the state's Community Care Services (CCS) program to incumbent Centene/WellCare. The contract, which covers behavioral health services to more than 4,500 Medicaid-eligible adults with serious mental illness or serious and persistent mental illness, runs from July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2024, with two optional one-year extensions. Centene/WellCare/Ohana has held the contract since 2013. QUEST Integration was first implemented in 2015 when the state merged its QUEST (traditional Medicaid) and QUEST Expanded Access (ABD/LTSS) programs into a single statewide, mandatory Medicaid managed care program.

# 4. MANAGED CARE ENROLLMENT UPDATE

Managed Medicaid enrollment in Hawaii was up 2.8% in June 2022 compared to year-end 2021, after increasing 12.5% in 2021 and 17.2% in 2020; decreasing 1.7% in 2019 and 4.0% in 2018; and increasing 1.1% in 2017 and 3.8% in 2016.

Hawaii currently offers Highly Integrated Dual Eligible Special Needs Plans (HIDE-SNPs) and Fully Integrated Dual Eligible Special Needs Plans (FIDE-SNPs). On January 1, 2024, the state launched Hawai'i's first FIDE-SNP.
